For the year 1953 Ontario, with  $44\cdot8$  p.c. of the registrations of motor vehicles in Canada, had  $56\cdot9$  p.c. of the total convictions for breaches of traffic regulations; Quebec in the same year had  $17\cdot0$  p.c. of the registered vehicles and  $20\cdot5$  p.c. of the convictions. In interpreting the figures in this way however it should be pointed out that traffic regulations are by no means uniform throughout Canada and no account is taken of the differences in the degrees of urbanization in the provinces. These two provinces have large urban centres but in provinces with lower degrees of urbanization, such as the Atlantic Provinces, Saskatchewan and Alberta, convictions are lower when considered in proportion to the number of motor vehicles registered.
