There was 8.2 p.c. less revenue freight carried on the railways in 1957 than in 1956. Each of the main commodity groups showed a decrease—agricultural products were down by 18.4 p.c., forest products 12.2 p.c., animals and animal products 7.0 p.c., mine products 6.2 p.c., and manufactures and miscellaneous products 3.0 p.c.
