Estimates are constructed for the total population of Canada and for each province and become available about the date to which they apply—June 1 of each year. Population estimates by province are also available on a quarterly basis. The estimates of population begin with the preceding census counts, to which are added the births of the intervening census year or years and from which the deaths are subtracted; immigrants are added and emigrants subtracted. No precise information is available on emigration. The DBS receives yearly from the United States the number of persons who gave Canada as country of last permanent residence before entering the United States as immigrants (see Chapter on Immigration and Citizenship, Part I, Section 3) and from the United Kingdom's Board of Trade the number of emigrants from Canada taking up permanent residence in the United Kingdom. Such data, however, are not available from other countries, though the proportion of total emigrants to all other countries is small. Family allowance statistics showing the number of migrant families by provinces are used in estimating interprovincial shifts in population.

The following statement shows the data used in preparing the annual estimates for 1957-60. The next succeeding census serves as a basis for revision of the annual estimates.
