

Among patients reported as on the books of tuberculosis institutions at the end of 1959, the peak frequency for men (1,301) occurred in the 60 years or over age group, and for women (671) in the 20-29 age group. More men than women were listed in each age group except those encompassing ages 10-29. Compared with 1,301 men, only 458 women aged 60 or over were carried on the books of tuberculosis sanatoria and units at Dec. 31, 1959; in contrast, the peak frequency for women aged 20-29 (671) was closely approximated in number by male patients (643).
