Income from dairy products during 1959 totalled nearly \$515,000,000, about \$19,000,000 more than in the previous year, as a result of both higher prices and increased production. Producers' returns from the sale of eggs were estimated at \$139,634,000, 6 p.c. below the amount realized in 1958; somewhat higher production was offset by lower prices.
