Reported on a production basis. Figure for 1959 not exactly comparable with 1958 because of a change in the method of valuation; if 1958 method had been used, 1959 shipments would have totalled approximately \$1,425,051,000.

Detailed Statistics by Group and Individual Industries.—Table 10 presents detailed statistics for 1958 and 1959 regarding the individual industries under which all industrial plants in Canada are classified. The industries are assembled under 17 main groups according to the Standard Industrial Classification.

In interpreting the statistics of individual industries it should be noted that the figures on employment, production, etc., do not refer to individual products but to all the products produced by an industry. For example, the value of production of the confectionery industry amounting to \$136,555,219 in 1959 does not imply that this was the value of confectionery produced. What it means is that the firms whose principal product was confectionery had a value of production of \$136,555,219. This figure, in addition to confectionery, includes all the subsidiary products made by these firms, such as chewing gum valued at \$12,391,497, ice cream valued at \$4,081,610, and bread and other bakery products valued at \$1,051,477. Confectionery is also produced as a subsidiary product by firms credited to other industrial classifications. The quantities and values of the principal individual commodities produced in 1958 are given in Table 11 (1959 not available at time of going to press). Commodities produced in small quantities are not included, but the list covers approximately 75 p.c. of total production.
