Subsection 3.—Telegraphs

At the end of 1960 nine telegraph and cable companies were in operation in Canada. These systems, composed of lines owned by the Federal Government and the chartered railway and telegraph companies, including the Canadian Overseas Telecommunications Corporation (see p. 862), increased their property and equipment to \$267,379,018, more than 17 p.c. above that reported in 1959. A new record was set for operating revenues at \$58,546,167, up 11 p.c. from the previous high of 1959, and net income also rose to a new high of \$11,761,141, 40 p.c. above the 1959 figure. Fewer telegrams were sent, the lowest number since 1942, but cablegrams continued to increase, numbering 2,663,598 in 1960.
