CBC Northern Radio Service.—Since November 1958 six radio stations in Northern Canada have been taken over by the CBC—at Whitehorse and Dawson in the Yukon Territory, at Yellowknife and Hay River in the Northwest Territories, at Goose Bay in Labrador and at Fort Churchill in northern Manitoba. Three others have been built at Fort Smith, Inuvik and Frobisher Bay in the Northwest Territories. Low-power relay transmitters were installed at Fort Nelson, B.C., and Watson Lake, Y.T.

Northern stations are able to pick up and relay news and topical programs from CBC transmitters at Lacombe, Alta., Watrous, Sask., and Sackville, N.B. Greater use of facilities at Sackville has resulted in the transmission of programs more extensively to the North.
