and, for spirits, a transfer tax are included. A drawback of 90 p.c. of the duty may be granted when domestic spirits, testing not less than 50 p.c. over proof, are delivered in limited quantities for medicinal or research purposes to universities, scientific or research laboratories, public hospitals, or health institutions in receipt of federal and provincial government aid.

The quantity of spirits manufactured has fluctuated greatly since 1920, varying from a low of 2,356,329 proof gal. in that year to a high of 35,555,059 proof gal. recorded in 1945. The total for 1960 was 32,188,806 proof gal.

The amounts of beverage spirits, malt beer, malt, cigars, ciragettes and other tobacco taken out of bond for consumption are given in the Domestic Trade Chapter, Table 38, p. 913.

Subsection 4.—Subsidies and Taxation Agreements with the Provinces

Subsidies.—A brief history of certain annual payments made by the Federal Government to the provinces under the provisions of the British North America Act and subsequent arrangements entered into from time to time appears in the 1956 Year Book, pp. 1068-1069. All payments made by the Federal Government to the provinces during the year ended Mar. 31, 1959 are shown in detail in Table 6, on p. 1053.

Taxation Agreements.—Early in World War II, the provincial governments vacated the personal income tax, corporation income tax and succession duty fields in favour of the Federal Government for the duration of the War and a limited period thereafter, in return
