British Columbia**3.3.1.10**

The government of British Columbia consists of a Lieutenant Governor, an Executive Council and a Legislative Assembly. On March 19, 1973 the Honourable Walter Stewart Owen took office as the Lieutenant Governor. The Legislative Assembly has 55 members who are elected for a term not to exceed five years. As a result of the December 11, 1975 election, 34 Social Credit members, 19 New Democrats, one Liberal and one Progressive Conservative were elected to the Assembly.

Each member of the Executive Council and the Legislative Assembly receives an annual allowance of \$16,000 and an annual expense allowance of \$8,000. In addition, the Premier is paid an annual salary of \$28,000, each Cabinet Minister (with portfolio) \$24,000 and each member of the Executive Council without portfolio \$21,000. The Leader of the Opposition and the Speaker receive special expense allowances of \$19,000; the Deputy Speaker and the Leader of a recognized political party, \$8,500. These salaries and expense allowances were reduced by 10% for the period April 1, 1976 to March 31, 1977.
