operation. Used car dealers must certify that vehicles comply with provincial equipment requirements.

Traffic regulations. In Canada, vehicles keep to the right-hand side of the road and motorists are required to observe traffic signs and lights. In Newfoundland, Quebec, New Brunswick, Ontario, Manitoba and Alberta the speed limits are 60 mph (97 km/h) and 50 mph (80.5 km/h) at night. In Nova Scotia, Saskatchewan and British Columbia the limit is 50 mph (80.5 km/h), although the latter two provinces may raise it in certain places. In Prince Edward Island it is 55 mph (88.5 km/h) and 50 mph (80.5 km/h) at night. In the Yukon and Northwest Territories for all vehicles the limit is 60 mph (97 km/h) unless otherwise posted.

Slower speeds are required in cities, towns and villages, at road intersections, railway crossings or at other places or times where the view of the highway for a safe distance ahead is in any way obscured. In Nova Scotia, British Columbia and the Northwest Territories slower speeds are also required in school zones and when passing public playgrounds. Most provinces require vehicles to stop when a school bus is stopped to load or discharge children. Truck speed limits are sometimes 5 mph (8 km/h) below automobile speed limits, but usually they are the same as for passenger vehicles. In most provinces accidents resulting in personal injury or property damage in excess of \$200 (\$100 in Quebec, \$350 in Alberta) must be reported to a police officer (in Nova Scotia to the Registrar of Motor Vehicles or to a police officer, in Quebec to a police officer or to the Motor
