Chapter 30 (March 13, 1975) An Act respecting the Electoral Boundaries Act changes the name of the electoral district of Lafontaine in Quebec to Lafontaine-Rosemont.

Chapter 31 (March 13, 1975) An Act respecting the Electoral Boundaries Readjustment Act changes the name of the electoral district of Berthier in Quebec to Berthier-Maskinonge.

Chapter 32 (March 24, 1975) West Coast Ports Operations Act, 1975 provides for the resumption and continuation of longshoring and related operations at ports on the west coast of Canada.

Chapter 33 (March 24, 1975) An Act respecting Canadian business corporations revises and reforms the law applicable to business corporations and provides for uniformity of business corporation law in Canada.

Chapter 34 (March 24, 1975) An Act to amend the Prairie Grain Advance Payments Act increases from \$6,000 to \$15,000 the maximum amount that may be paid to a producer as advance payments on grain to be delivered under a permit book.

Chapter 35 (March 24, 1975) An Act to provide for the recognition of the Beaver (Castor canadensis) as a symbol of the sovereignty of Canada.

Chapter 36 (March 25, 1975) Appropriation Act No. 1, 1975 grants certain sums of money for the public service for the financial year ending March 31, 1975.

Chapter 37 (March 25, 1975) Appropriation Act No. 2, 1975 grants certain sums of money for the public service for the financial year ending March 31, 1976.

Chapter 38 (March 26, 1975) An Act to amend the National Housing Act, among other provisions, sets at \$25 billion the aggregate amount of loans for which insurance policies have been issued under the act; authorizes the Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation to acquire land, instal services and effect improvements in order to lease land at low rental to non-profit corporations; authorizes amendments to encourage repair and improvement of family housing, hostel or dormitory accommodation, and the construction of houses and condominium units; authorizes CMHC to make loans for sewage treatment projects and grants toward preparation of comprehensive plans for sewerage facilities.

Chapter 39 (April 24, 1975) St. Lawrence Ports Operations Act, 1975 provides for the resumption and continuation of longshoring, checking, cargo repairing and related operations at certain ports in Quebec.

Chapter 40 (April 24, 1975) An Act to amend the Law Reform Commission Act increases the number of full-time members of the Law Reform Commission from four to five, and phases out the positions of part-time members.

Chapter 41 (April 24, 1975) An Act to amend the Railway Act provides authority for the Minister of Transport to acquire from railway companies certain information relating to costs.

Chapter 42 (April 24, 1975) An Act to amend the Civil Service Insurance Act extends provisions relating to children, married and unmarried women, and the unmarried woman's future husband and children.

Chapter 43 (April 24, 1975) An Act to repeal the Proprietary or Patent Medicine Act and to amend the Trade Marks Act.

Chapter 44 (May 8, 1975) An Act to amend the Senate and House of Commons Act, the Salaries Act and the Parliamentary Secretaries Act provides for increases in salaries, allowances and expenses.

Chapter 45 (May 8, 1975) An Act to amend the Farm Credit Act provides for an increase in the capital of the Farm Credit Corporation; extends the application of the act by providing for loans to establish young farmers; and sets loan amounts.

Chapter 46 (May 8, 1975) An Act to amend the Fort-Falls Bridge Authority Act removes the requirement for an act or joint resolution of the Congress of the United States and permits the start of bridge construction following conclusion of an agreement with the state of Minnesota.

Chapter 47 (June 19, 1975) Petroleum Administration Act imposes a charge on the export of crude oil and certain petroleum products, to provide compensation for certain petroleum costs, and regulates the price of Canadian crude oil and natural gas in interprovincial and export trade.
