Chapter 48 (June 19, 1975) An Act to amend the Judges Act and certain other Acts for related purposes and in respect of the reconstitution of the Supreme Courts of Newfoundland and Prince Edward Island provides for increases in salaries, allowances, expenses and annuities and provides for additional judges across Canada.

Chapter 49 (June 19, 1975) The Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission Act establishes the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission, amends the Broadcasting Act and other acts in consequence thereof and enacts other consequential provisions.

Chapter 50 (June 19, 1975) Cultural Property Export and Import Act regulates the export from Canada of cultural property and deals with the import into Canada of cultural property illegally exported from foreign states.

Chapter 51 (June 19, 1975) An Act to amend the Northern Canada Power Commission Act increases the number of commission members from three to five, provides for their expenses, and provides for changes in the financial management and banking practices of the commission.

Chapter 52 (June 19, 1975) An Act to amend the Territorial Lands Act clarifies the description of territorial land or corporations in which government employees are prohibited from acquiring interests.

Chapter 53 (June 19, 1975) British North America Act, (No. 2) 1975 amends the British North America Acts, 1867 to 1975, increases the number of senators from 102 to 104 and provides that the Yukon Territory and Northwest Territories shall each be entitled to one representative in the Senate.

Chapter 54 (June 19, 1975) Two-Price Wheat Act provides for payments to July 31, 1980 up to a maximum of \$1.75 per bushel for wheat produced and sold in Canada for human consumption in Canada, to make up the difference between the domestic price and the average export price.

Chapter 55 (June 19, 1975) Ocean Dumping Control Act provides for the control of the deliberate disposal of wastes and other substances into the ocean from ships, aircraft, platforms or any other man-made structures at sea.

Chapter 56 (June 19, 1975) An Act to amend the Salaries Act increases the salaries of the lieutenant governors of the provinces to \$35,000, from \$20,000 in Ontario and Quebec and \$18,000 in each of the other provinces.

Chapter 57 (June 26, 1975) Appropriation Act No. 3, 1975 grants certain sums of money for the public service for the financial year ending March 31, 1976.

Chapter 58 (June 26, 1975) An Act to amend the Old Age Security Act, to repeal the Old Age Assistance Act and to amend other Acts in consequence thereof.

Chapter 59 (June 26, 1975) An Act to amend the Department of Industry, Trade and Commerce Act provides that copies of invoices of goods imported into Canada and other related customs documents be made available to the Minister of Industry, Trade and Commerce and designated officers of his department.

Chapter 60 (June 26, 1975) An Act to amend the Explosives Act provides for greater control over the purchase, possession and transportation of explosives.

Chapter 61 (July 30, 1975) Petro-Canada Act establishes a national petroleum company as a Crown corporation.

Chapter 62 (July 30, 1975) An Act to amend the Excise Tax Act imposes a special excise tax on gasoline with provision for repayment of this tax under certain circumstances, decreases the tax payable on wine and exempts from sales tax thermal insulation material.

Chapter 63 (July 30, 1975) An Act to amend the Agricultural Stabilization Act redefines the methods by which the Agricultural Stabilization Board establishes new price structures for certain agricultural commodities such as cattle, hogs, sheep, industrial milk and industrial cream, corn and soybeans and, in some areas, oats and barley.

Chapter 64 (July 30, 1975) An Act to amend the Prairie Grain Advance Payments Act, No. 2 increases the maximum advance payments a producer may obtain on unthreshed grain or to finance the drying of damp or tough grain.
