Chapter 65 (July 30, 1975) An Act to amend the Federal-Provincial Fiscal Arrangements Act, 1972 provides for a change in the calculation from April 1, 1974 of provincial revenue equalization related to oil and gas revenues and provides for a change in the calculation of provincial tax revenue guarantee payments.

Chapter 66 (July 30, 1975) An Act to amend certain statutes to provide equality of status for male and female persons amends the Unemployment Insurance Act, the Pension Act and the National Defence Act.

Chapter 67 (July 30, 1975) An Act to amend the Public Service Staff Relations Act provides, among other things, for the appointment of not less than three deputy chairmen of the Public Service Staff Relations Board.

Chapter 68 (July 30, 1975) An Act to amend the Olympic (1976) Act authorizes the issue of gold Olympic coins and determines the selling price of the gold on the basis of the market price.

Chapter 69 (July 30, 1975) An Act to amend the Privileges and Immunities (International Organizations) Act provides the same privileges and immunities to the European Communities regarding its organization and officials in Canada as is provided to other international organizations.

Chapter 70 (July 30, 1975) An Act to amend the Customs Tariff, (No. 3) affects the rates of duty on a variety of goods such as petroleum products, hymn books, miners' safety lamps, agricultural machines, aircraft and aircraft engines.

Chapter 71 (December 2, 1975) An Act to amend the statute law relating to income tax (No. 2) provides for two temporary measures: a tax credit for investment in production facilities and an exemption from the withholding tax for long-term corporate borrowing; provides for a resource allowance in the areas of mining and petroleum; and provides for a reduction in the tax credit for high income individuals.

Chapter 72 (December 2, 1975) Environmental Contaminants Act provides that the Ministers of Environment and National Health and Welfare may appoint an Environmental Contaminants Board of Review, advisory committees, inspectors and analysts in order to protect human health and the environment from contaminating substances.

Chapter 73 (December 2, 1975) Lieutenant Governors Superannuation Act provides for the payment of superannuation benefits to Lieutenant Governors.

Chapter 74 (December 15, 1975) Appropriation Act, No. 4, 1975 grants certain sums of money for the public service for the financial year ending March 31, 1976.

Chapter 75 (December 15, 1975) Anti-Inflation Act provides for restraint of profit margins, prices, dividends and compensation in Canada; establishes the Anti-Inflation Board and the Anti-Inflation Appeal Tribunal; and provides for the appointment of an administrator to investigate, report on and issue orders to persons reported to have contravened AIB guidelines.

Chapter 76 (December 15, 1975) An Act to amend the Combines Investigation Act and the Bank Act and to repeal an Act to amend an Act to amend the Combines Investigation Act and the Criminal Code, among other things, deals with the abuse of industrial or intellectual property; makes bid-rigging a "per se" offence; defines new offences relating to conspiracy, combination, agreement or arrangement outside Canada as well as in the area of amateur and professional sport; and makes new provisions for offences relating to competition such as misrepresentation, false advertisements, double-ticketing, pyramid-selling, referral-selling, bait and switch selling, selling above advertised prices and promotional contests.

Chapter 77 (December 15, 1975) An Act to amend the Canadian Overseas Telecommunication Corporation Act changes the name of the Canadian Overseas Telecommunication Corporation to Teleglobe Canada.

Chapter 78 (December 15, 1975) King George V Cancer Fund Winding-up Act provides for the liquidation of the King George V Silver Jubilee Cancer Fund for Canada and for the transfer of the net proceeds to the National Cancer Institute of Canada.

Chapter 79 (December 20, 1975) Supplementary Borrowing Authority Act, 1975 provides that the Governor in Council may raise an amount not exceeding \$2 billion for public works and general purposes.

Chapter 80 (December 20, 1975) An Act to amend the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1971 provides for a number of amendments which include adding a new class to the existing classes of insurable employment,
