published or reprinted were translations from other languages. Of these, 278 were translated to French and 54 to English. As well, 515 published or reprinted were adapted

from books published outside Canada.

In an examination by category of copies sold of books produced in Canada, the novel/short story formed the largest group and accounted for 75.6% of the sales of books published or reprinted in 1975. Linguistics/philology formed 5.6% of copies sold, followed by general books (5.2%), mathematics/accounting (3.3%), entertainment/hobbies (1.4%) and business management (1.1%). These six categories accounted for 92.5%.
