<sup>1</sup> Since the Representation Act was passed these territories, exclusive of Yukon, have been erected into the provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewan, and in the acts constituting the provinces provision has been made for the continuance of their representation until the census of 1906 is taken. Some of the districts at present are partly in one province and partly in another.

The unorganized territories are without representation in Parliament.
