**Section 9.—Grèves et lock-out**

La Direction de l'économique et des recherches du ministère du Travail réunit la statistique des grèves et lock-out au Canada, à l'aide des rapports de la Commission d'assurance-chômage. Les tableaux 36 et 37 portent sur les grèves et lock-out qui immobilisent six travailleurs ou plus et qui durent au moins un jour ouvrable; ils incluent aussi les grèves et lock-out qui durent moins d'un jour ou touchent moins de six travailleurs mais qui, dans l'ensemble, représentent plus de neuf journées de travail. Les événements qui conduisent à un arrêt de travail sont souvent trop complexes pour permettre de distinguer statistiquement entre les grèves et les lock-out. Cependant, un arrêt de travail qui est nettement un lock-out ne se rencontre pas souvent.
