and values of articles to be added to manufactures in those several tables, if so classified. If added to the exports of manufactures as given in table xxi, p. 71, or in table xxix, p. 134, the total values would be \$101,310,252 for 1905, \$121,287,839 for 1906, \$127,496,446 for 1908 and \$121,286,176 for 1909. Added to the exports of manufactures to Britain in table xxi the total value for 1909 would be \$50,242,618, to the United States \$51,200,408 and to other countries \$19,843,150; and the total increase in the period from 1905 to 1909 would be almost 20 per cent. But of course the chief component value of these exports is that of raw material.
