SPAIN AND SPANISH POSSESSIONS.	<p>Since Aug. 1, 1923, Canada has adhered to the United Kingdom—Spain Treaty of Commerce of Oct. 31, 1922.</p> <p>Trade Agreement signed May 26, 1954, provisionally in effect July 1, 1954, definitively in force on ratification June 30, 1955.</p>	<p>Exchange of most-favoured-nation treatment. May be terminated on six months notice.</p> <p>Supplements and amends United Kingdom—Spanish Treaty of Commerce. Remains in effect for three years from ratification, and thereafter unless terminated on three months notice.</p>
SWEDEN.....	<p>United Kingdom—Sweden Convention of Commerce and Navigation of Mar. 18, 1826, applies to Canada.</p> <p>GATT effective May 1, 1950.</p>	<p>Exchange of most-favoured-nation treatment. Declaration of Nov. 27, 1911, provides means for separate termination by Dominions on one years notice.</p>
SWITZERLAND.....	<p>United Kingdom—Switzerland Treaty of Friendship, Commerce and Reciprocal Establishment of Sept. 6, 1855, applies to Canada. By exchange of notes Liechtenstein included under terms of this Agreement, effective Aug. 2, 1947.</p>	<p>Exchange of most-favoured-nation treatment. Convention of Mar. 30, 1914, provides means for separate termination by the Dominions on one years notice.</p>
SYRIA.....	<p>Special Arrangement by Order in Council of Nov. 19, 1946.</p> <p>Syria withdrew from GATT Aug. 6, 1951.</p>	<p>Canada grants most-favoured-nation tariff rates as long as Syria accords reciprocal treatment.</p>
TUNISIA.....	<p>Franco-Canadian Trade Agreement of 1933 applied to Tunisia (Tunisia is in customs union with France).</p>	<p>Since the creation of Tunisia as an independent State in 1956, Canada has continued to grant most-favoured-nation rates.</p>
TURKEY.....	<p>Exchange of notes signed Mar. 1, 1948; in effect Mar. 15, 1948.</p> <p>GATT effective Oct. 17, 1951.</p>	<p>Exchange of most-favoured-nation treatment. May be terminated on three months notice.</p>
UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS.	<p>Trade Agreement signed Feb. 29, 1956. Ratifications exchanged May 26, 1956.</p>	<p>Exchange of most-favoured-nation treatment and undertaking by U.S.S.R. to purchase determined quantity of Canadian wheat. In force for three years from date of signature and may thereafter be extended by mutual agreement.</p>
UNITED STATES.....	<p>Trade Agreement signed Nov. 17, 1938; suspended as long as both countries continue to be contracting parties to GATT.</p> <p>GATT effective Jan. 1, 1948.</p>	<p>Most-favoured-nation treatment exchanged under 1938 Agreement is continued under GATT.</p>
URUGUAY.....	<p>Trade Agreement signed Aug. 12, 1936; in force May 15, 1940. Additional Protocol signed Oct. 19, 1953.</p> <p>GATT effective Dec. 16, 1953.</p>	<p>Exchange of most-favoured-nation treatment. May be terminated on six months notice.</p>
VIETNAM.....	<p>Franco-Canadian Trade Agreement of 1933 applied to Vietnam.</p>	<p>Since the creation of Vietnam as an independent State, Canada has continued to accord most-favoured-nation rates.</p>
